GATHERING

Jesus Christ is the light of the world

The light no darkness can overcome

God is our light and our salvation

Our refuge and our stronghold

OPENING PRAYER

Merciful God,

when the storms rage and threaten to overtake us, awaken our faith to know the power of your peace. Deliver us from our fear and ease our anxiety. Help us to endure the time of uncertainty and give us strength to face the challenges ahead. Give us the assurance of your presence even in this time so that we can cling to your promise of hope and life shown to us through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

LITANY

**O Lord, when the waters rage and foam,
Still the storms and grant us your peace.**

**When the gift of creation becomes burden,
Still the storms and grant us your peace.**

**When our fears threaten to overtake us,
Still the storms and grant us your peace.**

**Speak your word to the wind and to the sea,
Fill us with faith.**

**Show us your care in the service of others,
Fill us with compassion.**

**Make the joy of your peace overflow in our lives,
Fill us with hope.**

PSALM 46 (Read aloud)

God is our refuge and strength,

A very present help in trouble.

Therefore, we will not fear, though the earth should change,

GOSPEL (read aloud)

Mark 4:35-41

On that day, when evening had come, he said to them, "Let us go across to the other side." And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. A great gale arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" and they were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?"
